The NPCC may amend this PIN from time to time. If the NPCC makes any substantial changes in the way its officials use your personal information, the NPCC will make that information available by amending this and any associated notices.

How and why the NPCC UKFPU uses your information

The NPCC UKFPU collects, processes and shares personal information to enable it to carry out its statutory and other functions, including those related to law enforcement.

We are only allowed to process your data where there is a lawful basis for doing so.

We may share your information with other organisations in the course of carrying out our functions, or to enable others to perform theirs and which are consistent with the NPCC functions.

Your information may have been passed to the UKFPU by Magistrates or Crown Courts, Home Office Departments, or by police forces in England and Wales, or from non-Government partners.

If you are subject to a Football Banning Order issued by a law court in England and Wales you must supply the Football Banning Orders Authority with any details of change of personal information as stated in your Football Banning Order provided to you at court at the time of your ban. **Please visit our NPCC page for further information: Page to be entered when complete.**

When NPCC UKFPU processes your personal data, the lawful basis for doing so is;

UK GDPR (Part 2 of the Data Protection Act 2018)

Article 6(1)(e): *“Processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller”.*

When processing special category data the lawful basis is;

Article 9(2)(g): *“Processing is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest”* and meets a condition in Schedule 1 including, but not limited to:

- Schedule 1(6) *“statutory etc and government purposes”*
- Schedule 1(2) *“Administration of justice and parliamentary purposes”*
- Schedule 1(10) *“Preventing or detecting unlawful acts”*
- Schedule 1(28) *“Standards of behaviour in sport”*
- Schedule 1(36) *“extension re substantial public interest”*

Law Enforcement Purposes (Part 3 of the Data Protection Act 2018)

Where data is processed for a “Law Enforcement Purpose”, defined under s31 of the DPA as the prevention, investigation, detection or prosecution of criminal offences or the execution of criminal penalties, including the safeguarding against and the prevention of threats to public security, the UKFPU will rely on the below:

Section 35(2)(b) *“Processing for any of the law enforcement purposes to the extent that is based on law and necessary for the performance of a task carried out for that purpose by a competent authority”*

Section 35(5) *“Processing is strictly necessary for the law enforcement purpose, meets a condition in Schedule 8 [including, but not limited to the below] and the controller has an appropriate policy document in place”*

- Schedule 8(1) *“Statutory etc purposes”*
- Schedule 8(2) *“Administration of justice”*

Storing your information

Your personal information will be held securely for as long as necessary for the purpose for which it is being processed, and in line with the UKFPU retention policy. More details of the policy can be found at <https://www.npcc.police.uk/privacy-policy/>

Requesting access to your personal data

You have the right to request access to the personal information we hold about you.

Data Retention Schedule

UK Football Policing Unit

This schedule outlines the length of time the NPCC retains personal data in accordance with its statutory function to administer Football Banning Orders for England and Wales, and the UKFPU function to prevent violence and / or disorder at or in association with football matches involving a UK domestic or international team.

The UKFPU collects data to be able to carry out its statutory and other functions, including those related to law enforcement, safeguarding against, and the prevention of, threats to public security.

Under the DPA 2018, UK GDPR, the UKFPU must only retain data for as long as is necessary and the purpose for which it is processed, and varies depending on the purpose of processing, the minimum length of time is 2 years. UKFPU retain personal data to comply with the Football Spectators Act 1989 14 C (5).

Review of Retention Periods and Data Storage

UKFPU will review their data retention schedule regularly and or as required by legislative changes, to ensure data continues to be held for as long as is necessary, and for the purpose for which it is processed.

This document will be updated at each review.
