NPCC Response:

The NPCC does have recorded information captured by your request. I have provided it in full below.

1. There have been 5,124 people who have received two or more COVID-19 fixed penalty notices. This figure is across all regulations types for both England and Wales.
2. The highest number of fixed penalties received under COVID-19 regulations is 10.

Annex A

Legislation – Section 16

- (1) It shall be the duty of a public authority to provide advice and assistance, so far as it would be reasonable to expect the authority to do so, to persons who propose to make, or have made, requests for information to it.
