

Objective(s) – Session 2 – Antisemitism Commission

- In the wake of the Heaton Park and Bondi Beach terrorist attacks and amidst frequent protest-related tensions, it is clear that there is a need for a clear, consistent national policing approach to tackling antisemitism. There are currently differing approaches, including the stances taken by the Metropolitan Police Service and Greater Manchester Police in terms of policing protest activity.
- This divergence was raised directly in Dame Mordaunt and Lord Mann's recent review into antisemitism in the UK, which recommended Chiefs Council and the College of Policing come forward with proposals on how consistency in decision making and standards could be embedded in dealing with antisemitic crimes.
- This item is therefore an opportunity for Chiefs to collectively discuss and seek consistency in our policing stance. This is important not only for national alignment in approach but also to uphold public trust and confidence.
