- BWV is used to engage with communities to promote transparency and accountability
- We will develop and adapt – by shaping and producing national guidance, and publish communications on current and emerging trends and risks
- We will share best practice and lessons learnt – by maintaining a national BWV network, and collaborating with police colleagues, partner agencies and international peers

### Public and Internal Confidence in BWV

Build trust in BWV both within policing and amongst our communities, by ensuring it is reliable, consistently used, and features within scrutiny to support transparency and accountability.

### Operational excellence and improved criminal justice outcomes

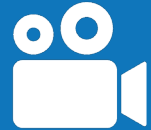
Optimise BWV to consistently deliver the best possible outcomes for criminal justice.
